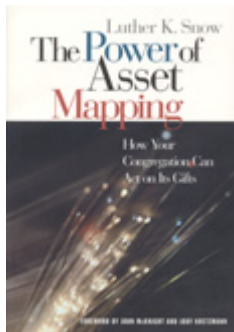


## Wrestling with the Big Questions
